## Gerald Smythe lived life to the fullest

Gerald W. Smythe of North Bangor, NY, died September 17, 2003 in a private plane crash in St-Anicet. He was 61.

The former Huntingdon-area man who was born in Ormstown on March 1, 1942, attended St. Joseph and Notre Dame schools in Huntingdon. He was the eldest son of William and Edna (Curran) Smythe of Huntingdon.

In 1964, he married Elizabeth "Betty" Bisnette at Notre Dame Church in Malone. She survives.

For 26 years, he had owned and operated Smythe Welding and Machine Shop in North Bangor, N.Y.. Over the years, his many interests involved working on a wide range of motorized vehicles.
