

# Strangers no more

## Tom Sailman

Kelsey Jones, of Hinchinbrooke, died in the Jewish General Hospital, Montreal, following a long battle against complications from leg surgery,

Dr. Jones, one of Canada's foremost musicians, composers and teachers, lived in Hinchinbrooke since the 1960s when he and his wife, Rosabelle, sought a home outside Montreal. They bought the

Sweet farmhouse, and acreage, from Fred Elliott. a local farmer, which straddies the Canada-U.S. border at Cook's Lines, and soon began enticing friends from elsewhere in Quebec and Ontario to join them in the community along the Elliott Side Road.

First to join them was George Johnston, an outstanding poet and professor Ottawa's - Carleton University, who brought his large family to buy the Leslie Rennie property across the road from the Jones. Soon after was Don McCrimmon, a Montreal advertising executive and his wife Jean, who took up residence on part of the Fred Elliott property at the corner of the Side Road and the First Concession. Next came Tom Sailman, a retired Canadian Army officer, and teacher in Ottawa, with his wife Polly and then Ran and Arlene Ide from Toronto, Mr. Ide, an educator, had been the head of TV Ontario, a

caster.

To the probable amazement of local farmers, the strangers "from away" soon fit in nicely and helped the Elliott's rejuvenate the Side Road. All were soon seen helping out in the hay fields and filling Fred Elliott's barn.

On the harpsichord, Kelsey Jones, was one of the founders of the "Baroque Trio", a Montreal classical group that performed across Canada and on the CBC. He and his wife Rosabelle were a

years ago. provincial educational television broadtwo-piano team that also performed across Canada and on the national CBC network. Dr. Jones later taught at McGill's Conservatory of Music and on his retirement in 1984 was selected to be a Professor Emeritus.

Dr. Jones' compositions were many, ranging from the symphonic jazz piece, "Opus Unum" to chamber music, concertos, and symphony, an oratorio and an

The Joneses had traveled widely in Europe for many years and even bought and redesigned a recreation vehicle for their frequent trips around the continent and especially to Florida in the winters. Rosabelle predeiced Dr. Jones in 1995.

Dr. Jones was born in South Norwalk, Conn. U.S.A. June 17,1922 and began his formal music education at Mount Allison University, Sackville, N.B. in 1939.

He received his Bachelor of Music degree there in 1946,a second B.Mus. in theory and composition from the University of Toronto under Sir Ernest MacMillan in 1947, and from 1947-48 was on the Faculty of the Music Conservatory at Mount Allison, In 1948, Dr. Jones completed studies for his Doctorate of Music from the University of Toronto under Professor Leo Smith and Dr. Healey Willan and in 1949 studied in Paris under Nadia Boulanger, In 1950, Dr. Jones founded and became the first conductor of the Saint John, N.B. Symphony Orchestra, and in 1953 moved to Montreal before moving to Cook's
