

#### Woman killed in Saint-Stanislas-de-Kostka

A 32-year old woman died and a man suffered injuries in a head-on collision last Tuesday, June 7, on Route 201 in Saint-Stanislas-de-Kostka, about a kilometre from Route 236.

The tragedy occurred when the driver of a 1995 Ford Aspire vehicle swerved into the oncoming lane, for an unexplainable reason, according to the police. The vehicle then slammed into a 2003 Jeep Liberty that spun out of control.

The victim is Carole Miljour, of Saint-Louis-de-Gonzague. She was alone in her car. The driver of the other vehicle, a 44-year man, was taken to the regional hospital in Valleyfield for treatment.

The Sûreté du Québec of the Beauharnois-Salaberry MRC were called in to investigate the accident.
