The collision last June 4, where a man died at the intersection of the Seigneuriale side road and New Erin road in Godmanchester, has claimed a second victim six days later.

According to an article in The Saint-François newspaper last week, Chantal Faubert, a 33-year old Valleyfield resident, surrendered to her injuries suffered at the time of the accident. The young woman was seriously hurt when a motorist hit the motorcycle she and her companion were riding. According to the investigation conducted by the Haut Saint-Laurent Sûreté du Québec police, the driver of the car didn't make the obligatory stop at the intersection, leaving no chance for the motorcyclists to avoid being struck as they were passing in front of the vehicle.

Seriously injured, the lady was transported to the hospital. She suffered serious head injuries at the time of impact and in spite of the care provided by the doctors treating her, she died six days later. Her partner, Richard Allen, a 36-year old Saint-Louis-de-Gonzague resident, died at the scene of the accident.

The motorist, an 18-year old man from Greenfield Park, was stopped by police at the scene of the accident and was given a breathalyzer test, which proved to be positive. The individual could be accused of impaired driving causing a death
