Doris Lavery celebrates her 100th birthday

Doris Lavery reached 100 years of age on September 27th and the event was celebrated with a tea held in her honour by fellow members of "The Reviewers" Book Club, of which Doris is an active member.

The tea was held at the home of Anita Greig September 29th where the hostess, Ruth Brown, served a delicious assortment of treats including, of course, the birthday cake decorated appropriately for this great occasion.

The guest of honour shared a few details of her life. Doris is the fourth of five children born to Harry Woods and his wife Hannah Zelda Dorlum and she spent most of her youth in Welsford, Queens County, in New Brunswick.

Around 1919, her family moved to Fredericton where Doris later earned her B.A. at the University of New Brunswick. She continued her education at McGill University, successfully acquiring her B.S.W., which then allowed her to earn her living as a social worker.

Clarence Lavery and Doris were married in 1936 and raised a family of three children - Susan and Hannah-May, their adopted daughters, and Richard their son. Although they lived mainly in the
