Early morning minor vehicle accident proves fatal

According to the Haut Saint-Laurent Sûreté du Québec, a 38-year old Huntingdon resident died in a minor vehicle accident that happened in front of 6184 Ridge Road in Godmanchester last Thursday, March 2, at 12:47 a.m.

However, "the accident is under investigation" as Christina Duheme's Dodge Caravan left the road and struck a small tree, said Sergeant Robert Brabant.

"The damage to the vehicle was not

severe so an autopsy will be done," said Sergeant Brabant, noting the victim didn't even attempt to brake.

"She went straight into the trees for no reason," he said. Therefore, an inspection of the vehicle is currently being done.

The accident occurred on a straight stretch of the road. The asphalt was dry and the weather was clear.

For now, "there is no reason why it happened," said Sergeant Brabant.

A passing motorist reported the accident.
