Norris Rowe died this past week. He was 86. He was one of those "creative" mechanics of yesteryear, one who wouldn't overlook the possibility of filing down to size a GM generator brush to make it fit in an orphaned and soon-to-be-extinct German make, the NSU, my first car. Apart from the fact that cars don't have generators anymore, who would do that for you today?

I heard of his death early the next morning in - where else? - the Franklin post office. A gentleman, known to all in Franklin, was recounting that he, himself, was two days older than Norris and that he was "ready", that the idea of death did not trouble him. The post-mistress and I both responded, "It's out of the question. You know, there's a quota - Norris is gone, now you have to wait."

Norris was one of the first people I had the pleasure to know when I came here in 1973. These people are, for me, the "originals" - those who, in my first months here, felt it important to convey to me a history and a sense of place. I am ever in their gratitude and, from time to time, I believe it fitting to recall their names.
