Fatal motorcycle accident

A 31-year old man died in a motorcycle accident in Hemmingford this past Monday, October 9. The tragedy happened around 1:35 p.m. The motorcyclist was traveling on Route 202 when a car coming from the opposite direction attempted to pass another vehicle and the motorcycle and car collided.

According to the first emergency personnel at the site, the motorcyclist was still

alive when they arrived. Nevertheless, he was later pronounced dead at the Haut-Richelieu Hospital.

The victim was Jean-Philippe Arseneault, a resident of Saint-Mathieu-de-La Prairie.

A police investigation by the Jardins-de-Napierville Sûreté du Québec has been opened concerning this fatal accident. They will clearly establish if either the motorist or the motorcyclist showed negligence.
