Road tragedy in St-Stanislas-de-Kostka

Driver dies after running into cows

A young man from the Athelstan sector of Hinchinbrooke lost his life in a head-on collision between his car and a herd of cows late in the afternoon of November 28 along Rang Cinq in St-Stanislas-de-Kostka. The tragedy occurred towards 5:50 p.m.

Dany Taillefer, age 25, died when the Chevrolet Camaro he was driving ran into a small herd of cows that had escaped from their enclosure together. According to information from the Beauharnois-Salaberry detachment of the Sûreté du Québec, one of these animals became wedged on the hood of the moving vehicle after being struck. The car traveled along the road for approximately 900 metres before coming to a stop in a ditch. Four animals were killed instantly.

Witnesses raced to the aid of the young driver, who died minutes later at Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital, in spite of efforts by paramedics to revive him. An autopsy will be performed on the victim's body.
