Young man killed in a collision in Havelock

A young man from Huntingdon lost his life in a collision early Thursday evening along Rte. 202 in Havelock.

The accident took place near 5 p.m. when a van travelling east ran right into a snowplow coming in the opposite direction. As the vehicles approached each other, the driver lost control of his vehicle.

The driver of the van, 18-year-old Placid Dineen, died in the collision. He

was taken to the Barrie Memorial Hospital in Ormstown, where he was pronounced dead. The snowplow driver, a 40-year-old man from Havelock, escaped with minor injuries.

The Haut St-Laurent detachment of the SQ has opened an investigation into this accident. Police are not ruling out the possibility that this tragedy is ascribable to bad weather, which made the road slippery.
