

One dead in Très-St-Sacrement accident

A 45-year-old man died in a car accident Friday at around 11:10 p.m. along Rte. 138 in Très-St-Sacrement.

According to information from the Haut St-Laurent detachment of the Sûreté du Québec, the tragedy occurred when the driver lost control of his vehicle, which was travelling west. The vehicle suddenly ran off the road to the right, only to re-cross and end its route to the left of the road.

The victim is Alain Bélanger, a Steresident, who was alone in artimo cle. Upon the arrival of first-aid workers, he showed no vital signs. The man was taken to Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital, where his death was recorded.
