### Man dies in accident at St. Louis de Gonzague

One man is dead and another seriously injured after an accident July 11 at approximately 10:30 p.m. on Du Pont Street near the intersection of North River Road in St. Louis de Gonzague. The victim, Jean Benoit Jr., an 18-year-old resident of Ormstown, was declared dead on scene. He was the front-seat passenger of a car driven by Sebastien Gendron, age 20, of St. Louis de Gonzague. He is in intensive care at a Montreal hospital.

It appears the driver lost control of his vehicle at Du Pont exit, then hit a Hydro-Quebec pole and several trees before ending up in a ditch. Speed is suspected to be a factor of the accident, however an investigation will determine the exact cause.
