"Tommy, can I pitch?"

In a high, sweet, squeaky voice that always built up to the drawn-out last word, ten-year old Julien Rougeau asked the question of his baseball coach so often that it became a team catchphrase.

Soon, everyone was mimicking it:
"Tommy, can I peeeetch?"

Julien Rougeau, 17, died August 21. It is always shocking when a young man dies. It is absolutely wrenching when

it's a young man one knows.

I remember him best as a cheerful, smiling ten-year old baseball player who was a joy to coach. His sandy hair, skewed cap and wide grin gave him a charming Huckleberry Finn look.

He took advice well. He played happy. He made everyone around him a little

"Tommy, can I pitch?"

He left baseball too soon, not quite ready at that tender age to be a dominating pitcher like his dad is. Julien went on

to do whatever it is that baseball-less adolescents and teenagers do. I do not know what other dreams Julien pursued in the years since, but I never completely lost sight of him.

Every time I saw him on the streets, I'd wave at the charming kid who had always wanted to pitch. And Julien would always grin and wave back, even though it's not cool for a young homey to acknowledge older folk.

Even as his sullen mates would look down at their oversized sneakers and tug at their trendy hoods, Julien would look up and smile widely in that roguish way of his
