Born in Franklin Centre on November 29, 1908, Mrs. Elsie Thompson will celebrate her 100th birthday on Saturday. The centenarian can still boast that she lives on her own in a house near her son's farm in Dewittville. Mrs. Thompson is the mother of three: her son, Melvin; a daughter, Greta, of Ormstown; and another daughter, Thelma, now deceased. Shown right with her great granddaughter, Amber, age 9, who visits with her nearly every day, Mrs. Thompson has another great granddaughter, Sydney Leger, age 6, who visits whenever she can.

Mrs. Thompson counts seven grandchildren among her brood and said some of her fondest memories are of her playing hide-and-seek with them. Known for her baking and cooking as well as her

African violets and handicrafts, Mrs. Thompson was honoured by the Huntingdon Fair committee this summer for her many contributions over numerous years.

She keeps busy with knitting and crocheting mostly, and usually watches the news on T.V. "When I feel to sit down, I need to do something to keep my fingers going," she said, indicating that she suffers a little from arthritis, but has no other health complaints.

There may be a few physical limitations to being 100, but there are not any intellectual ones for Mrs. Thompson. She said she gets help from Phyllis Todd of Dewittville with laundry and ironing and odd jobs that she can no longer do. "I love it," said Thompson, acceptingly. "I just sit back and let her do it."
